1. ANNOUNCEMENT

Southern Capes Motorcycle Club Inc., hereafter called the Promoter will conduct 2010 Australian Quad Motocross Championships for Quad Motocross Seniors and Juniors at the Southern Capes Motorcycle Club Motocross Track, 37 Gibb Road, JINDONG via BUSSELTON W.A. on Friday 15th, Saturday 16th & Sunday 17th October 2010

2. JURISDICTION

- 2.1** The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling Australia which has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit MA 0838 and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia National Competition Licenses and MNZ License holders who hold a start permission from MNZ with proof of insurance to FIM standard. If international competitors other than NZ enter, ALL international competitors (including NZ competitors) must hold an FIM recognised license issued by their respective FMN, in addition to a start permission to compete which certifies that they hold current insurance to FIM standard.
- 2.2** The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCR's) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these Supplementary Regulations, and any final instructions approved by Motorcycling Australia. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

4. ENTRIES

- 4.1** Entries are now open and close 24th September 2010, lodgement of entry is not a guarantee of acceptance and the promoter reserves the right to reject an entry. Late entries will be accepted solely at the promoter's discretion. A late fee of \$50 may be charged.
- 4.2** In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by Southern Capes Motorcycle Club Inc if such retention is approved by Motorcycling Australia.
- 4.3** Only entries received on the official entry form that is accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
- 4.4** Entry fees will only be refunded if a rider informs Southern Capes Motorcycle Club Inc in writing, 10 days before the event. A medical certificate is required if a rider withdraws less than 10 days before the event.

5. ENTRY FEE

- 5.1** \$200.00 Pro Championship
\$190.00 per Senior Class (Other than Pro Championship)
\$150.00 per Junior Rider/Jumbo Junior
\$ 50.00 per Nipper Rider
\$ 22.00 MA Levy fee is applicable to all riders (in addition to the above fees)
- 5.2** Payment by Cheque or Money Order only. Any fees for dishonoured cheques will be the responsibility of the entrant
- 5.3** Cheques and Money Orders are to be made payable to Southern Capes Motorcycle Club Inc (SCMC)
- 5.4** Please include a self addressed stamped envelope for confirmation of entry and any final instructions. Final instructions may also be viewed at waquadmx.com

6. ENTRY PASSES

- 6.1** Two (2) passes per entry will be issued to each entrant, extra can be purchased with your entry; these will be provided at sign in. IF YOU DO NOT PRESENT A PASS AT THE GATE BEFORE 9AM ON RACE DAY, YOU WILL BE CHARGED THE NORMAL ADMISSION FEE ON THE DAY, THERE WILL BE NO REFUND OF ADMISSION FEES.

7. INSURANCE

- 7.1** National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.
- 7.2** Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licenses. **It is strongly recommended that competitors give consideration to taking out weekly benefits Insurance.**

8. MEDICAL SERVICES

- 8.1** St John's Ambulance will be in attendance for the entirety of the event. It is a condition of entry that First Aid MUST be accepted wherever deemed necessary by the attending First Aiders or Ambulance Officers. The Clerk of Course of the day has the right to refuse racing of a rider if First Aid requirements are not adhered to.

9. SCRUTINEERING

- 9.1** Scrutineering will begin at **2pm – 6pm Friday 15th October 2010** - **7am – 8am Saturday 16th October 2010**
Scrutineering will be held in the pits at Southern Capes Motorcycle Club
- 9.2** Machines entered in the competition must have successfully passed a machine examination prior to taking part in practice, qualifying or racing. An MA decal will be placed on the front number plate to indicate that it has been successfully examined
- 9.3** Current competition licenses and full riding gear must be presented at scrutineering. Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the meeting. Machines which suffer accident damage in practice or race sessions must be re-examined before participating again.
- 9.4** Once scrutinised machines are to be kept in the pit area at all times when not being used for competition, unless permission to remove the motorcycle has been granted by the Steward of the meeting. Any motorcycle removed without permission may be excluded and all points forfeited for the day’s event and/or incur a fine of up to \$100.
- 9.5** In addition to supervising the pulling down and checking of machines after official protests have been received by the Clerk of Course in accordance with the GCR’s, the Steward can order that any machine may be measured and if this occurs the Scrutineer will supervise a rider’s team member to pull down any machine that has taken part in the event. Failure to comply with this rule will result in automatic exclusion from the event results.
- 9.6** Machines will not be sealed for later checking after the event. All machines that are to be pulled down and scrutineered will take place at the circuit before the machine is released by the Scrutineer. A member of the rider’s team must be available at all times to carry out the strip down under the control of the Scrutineer. Failure to comply with this rule will result in automatic exclusion from the event results.

Age of senior riders is taken from the first day of the event. Age of juniors is from 1st January 2010.

11. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

- 11.1** To constitute a class for the purpose of gaining Championship status, the number of contestants entered and competing in each class shall be 10. Jumbo juniors is a minimum of 8 if any less the race will be conducted at the discretion of the promoter.
- 11.2** Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition, the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards and/or prize money, will be at the discretion of Southern Capes Motorcycle Club Inc, subject to Motorcycling Australia approval.

12. STARTS

By mechanical drop back gate. Clutch start. Maximum 20 gates. Machines shall be placed on the starting line. The starter will hold up a green flag and from this moment the riders are under his control. Hold up a fifteen (15) second board for a full fifteen (15) seconds. At the end of the fifteen (15) seconds, a five (5) second board will be displayed. The gate will then drop between five (5) to ten (10) seconds after the five (5) second board is shown.

13. RACE FORMAT

Practice will commence at approx 8.30am on Saturday for all classes. Approximate 10 minutes per class. Classes may be combined for practice. There is no practice on Sunday.

16. PRESENTATIONS

An after event dinner will be held on Sunday 17th October 2010 at 6.30pm at the track and will consist of a buffet roast dinner. Tickets must be pre-purchased with entry to confirm numbers. Presentations will be conducted at the dinner. Riders who finish on the podium must attend presentation.

Dinner Tickets: \$25 per head Adults - \$15 per child under 12 years.

17. MACHINE AND RIDERS

- 17.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Quad Motocross competition.
- 17.2 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.
- 17.3 After the Clerk of Course has given permission and notice is given in writing to the Secretary of the meeting 15 minutes before the commencement of the race, a change of motorcycle may be permitted.
- 17.4 Production Class: A production bike must be a factory standard quad; the following may be changed – all and any fluids, handlebars, grips, tyres (must remain standard size), park brake mechanisms may be removed. If it is NOT listed it cannot be changed.
- 17.5 Jumbo Juniors: A jumbo bike must have an OEM frame and engine cases.
- 17.6 Junior Standard Bikes: Where it is stated that a junior bike is standard it must be OEM standard. Please refer to GCR 22.4.1.4 “Where in junior competition the words OEM standard are used, all quads must be OEM machines with no modifications”. However the following may be altered, colour, seat, mudguards, handlebars, grips, levers, cables, chains, tyre brand and tread pattern, carburettor jets and spark plugs.

18. RIDING NUMBERS

- 18.1 Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their registered riding number or their preferred riding number. All others will be allocated numbers at Southern Capes Motorcycle Club’s discretion.
- 18.2 All number plates on all machines must comply with the GCR’s and must not contain any decals or advertising other than the required MA decal.

19. GRID POSITIONS

Grid selection for the first race/final and all heat races in each class will be by peg selection, subsequent race/finals will be by finishing order from previous race/final.

Grid selection – Race/heat 1 – Rider to select a peg. Peg number = gate number

Grid Selection – Remaining race/final – Rider will select their gate as per finishing order of the previous race i.e 1st place = 1st selection of all gates, 20th placing = 20th selection of remaining gates.

20. RIDERS BRIEFING

A riders briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing, which ALL competitors MUST attend. Details will be included in the final instructions.

21. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

Track Length is 1.85km. Track surface is hard pack with a loamy gravel surface and man-made jumps. All competitors will be given the opportunity to inspect the track on foot prior to the commencement of practice. Any rider with safety concerns in respect to the track should take them up with the Clerk of Course.

22. FACILITIES

A full canteen service and bar will be available Saturday and Sunday. Please obey the promoter’s instructions as to parking. Please note GCR 4.1.4.4, “The carrying or consumption of alcoholic beverages in the pit area is prohibited”.

Camping will be permitted at the track – limited space is available and must be pre-booked - \$30 per vehicle. Please indicate and pay for camping with entry form. Please supply vehicle registration number on the entry form.

23. NOISE EMISSIONS

To ensure compliance with GCRs and local environmental regulations regular noise testing may be conducted. All machines must comply with a static test at 94/96db as per GCRs, as required by the Environmental Protection Authority. Subject to the Clerk of Course's approval of noise reduction measures, the machine may be cleared to recommence racing. A second infringement will result in immediate black flagging and exclusion from meeting. Noise testing may take place at any time at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer of the Clerk of Course. Refer to GCR 12.10

24. TYRES

Paddle type sand tyres are not permitted.

25. ANTI-DOPING POLICY

25.1 All competitors and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, as carried out by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority. Refer to GCR 11 for details.

25.2 If you have any questions about banned substances, check Chapter 11 of the MOMS, and if your question is not answered, contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline: 1800 020 506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prize money may be delayed at Motorcycling Australia's discretion until the results of the tests are known.

26. ALCOHOL TESTING PROCEDURE

All competitors and officials are advised that random breath-testing may take place during the competition.

27. CODE OF CONDUCT

All competitors, officials, parents and guardians are reminded of MA's Code of Conduct found in Appendix 3 of the MOMS or online at www.ma.org.au, a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. This Code of Conduct applies to this Meeting and will be enforced.

28. GATE ENTRY ADMISSION CHARGES

Adult: \$10 per day

Children: Under 16 years free.

29. TRANSPONDERS

29.1 Transponders will be compulsory at this meeting. Transponders will be supplied at a cost included in the entry fee. Each machine must have its own transponder attached. Transponders must be fitted for all practice sessions

Conditions of entry to hiring a Transponder

- . When a transponder is transferred to the competitor, it is the competitor's responsibility for any repairs or replacement cost of the transmitter if damaged or lost.
- . It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the transponder is mounted correctly, and securely to prevent damage from fouling other components on the machine.
- . It is the competitor's responsibility that transponders are returned in good condition at the end of the event, or if due to machine failure or injury before the machine leaves the pit area. A fee of \$50 will apply to competitors who do not return transponders on the day.
- . Your National License will be held as deposit when the transponder is allocated.
- . Transponders must be returned to the designated person as advised at the rider's briefing.
- . Transponders not returned on the same day, or not returned to the designated person, in addition to the \$50 fee, the hirer is responsible for the transponder until it arrives back to the promoter.
- . This includes while in transit with Australia Post and or by courier. No excuse will be entertained for non-delivery. It is recommended transponders be hand delivered.

29.2 GENERAL RULES

- . **Numbers & Number plates:** Must comply with the 2010 Manual of Motorcycle Sport

- . **Back Numbers:** All competitors must wear a corresponding and legible back number at all times when practising and competing.
 - . **Riding of Motorcycles/Quads:** The riding of any competing motorcycles/Quads in the pits or car park or camping area is not permitted. Infringing riders will be brought before the Clerk of Course of the meeting. Any offender may be fined \$50, which must be paid before any further participation is permitted. No Pit bikes or non-competing motorcycles are permitted to be ridden at any time at the venue.
 - . **Bicycles:** Bicycles are not permitted in the pit area or on the racing circuit. No pit bikes will be allowed anywhere in the complex.
 - . **Animals:** Are not permitted into the grounds. Guide dogs are permitted.
 - . **Bumper Bars:** Edges not to be over 45 degrees (L=okay)
 - . **Abandonment:** In the event of the meeting being abandoned due circumstances beyond the control of the promoters before racing commences, entry fees will be returned, less a fee per entry to cover administration costs. Once the competition has commenced on the Steward of the meeting has the authority to abandon the meeting and their decision shall be final. In such cases the Steward will rule on the results according to circumstances.
 - . **Reservations:** The Steward of the meeting reserves the right to alter, postpone or cancel all or part of the events program.
 - . **Unauthorised:** Persons are prohibited from entering the track infield area. Such unauthorised persons will be removed from prohibited areas,
 - . **No Hassle Policy:** Any rider, entrant or person associated with a rider or entrant shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner in any dealing whatsoever, with any official of the meeting. A rider shall be responsible for his/her own conduct and that of any person with whom he/she is associated who abuses or threatens in any manner, either verbally or physically, any official. Penalties which may be imposed by the Clerk of Course for breach include reprimand or warning, a fine or exclusion from the meeting.
- Fuel:** Fuel testing may take place at any time during the meeting.
- 29.3** Pit Sites: A limited number of premium pit sites will be available. Prices & pit site positions available by contacting Michael MacDonald from Southern Capes Motorcycle Club. Trailers will only be permitted in certain areas of the pits. Pit fee is to help cover the cost of security guards for Friday & Saturday nights.
- 29.4** Southern Capes Motorcycle Club reserves the right to prevent any team or rider displaying sponsorship signage or advertising material that it deems to be in conflict with its contracts. NO pit/sponsorship flags may be displayed within 3 metres of the track fencing unless permission is given.
- 29.5** Any team or rider who wishes to sell merchandise must seek approval from Southern Capes Motorcycle Club in writing, a fee will apply.
- 29.6** **You may be required to supply a flaggie for either or both of the days.**

1. I THE UNDERSIGNED (see below): [Insert Name]

HEREBY AGREE with Motorcycling Australia Limited ("MA") that I am by this agreement entitled to participate in the motorcycle activity/meeting listed in Schedule 2 (hereinafter called "the Meeting" or the "Event") at the venue listed at Schedule 3 (hereinafter called "the Venue") on the terms and conditions set out in this document.

2. DEFINITIONS

- In this declaration:
- "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand, damage, cost or expense however arising including but not limited to negligence but does not include a claim against a Motorcycling Organisation under any right expressly conferred by its constitution or regulation;
 - "Indemnitees" means and includes the persons, organisations and bodies corporate whose names appear in Schedule 1.
 - "MA" means Motorcycling Australia Limited;
 - "State Controlling Body" (SCB) means a state or territory motorcycling association affiliated as a member of MA;
 - "Motorcycling Activities" means performing or participating in any capacity in any authorised or recognised Motorcycling Organisation event, meeting or activity;
 - "Motorcycling Organisation" means and includes MA, and the MA members (including the SCBs and affiliated clubs) and where the context so permits, their respective directors, officers, members, servants or agents.

3. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISKS, DANGERS & OBLIGATIONS

I ACKNOWLEDGE that:

- motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport (whether as a competitor, recreational rider, coach, official or media) at the Meeting I take and am exposed to certain risks and dangers and am under certain obligations as follows:
 - that I may be injured, physically or mentally, and may be killed;
 - that my machinery or equipment may be damaged, lost or destroyed;
 - that competitors may ride dangerously or with a lack of skill;
 - that track or event conditions may be hazardous and may vary without warning or predictability;
 - that organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings are frequently obliged to make decisions under pressure of time/or events;
 - that any policy of insurance of or in respect of my life or physical or mental health may be voided;
 - that there may be no or inadequate facilities for treatment or transport of me if I am injured;
 - that I have an obligation to myself and to others to act safely and within the rules and regulations of MA;
- the Indemnitees do not make any warranty that the services at the Meeting will be provided with due care and skill or that any materials provided in connection with the services will be fit for the purpose for which they are supplied;
- to the extent that any warranty is implied it is excluded to the full extent permitted by law;
- have voluntarily read and understood this warning and accept and assume the inherent risks in participating in the Event.

4. WARNING UNDER THE FAIR TRADING ACT 1999 (VIC)
