The horsepower that the 250 2 stroke is equivalent to the 450 4 stroke and this in fairness is the class it should be racing in. At present one manufacturer has spent large amounts to develop the 250 2 stroke so it is the bike of choice due to its unfair horsepower advantage and smooth power delivery. These 2 characteristics combined make it an unfair advantage.  Most categories of motorsports are determined by horsepower and this should be the way in this sport to eliminate the unfair advantage that the 2 stroke 250 has over its underpowered 4 stroke 250 machine.
